Why this file exists

The current blog pipeline expects reference-style links instead of inline markdown links. That means external sources should look like the YouTube example [1] or the GitHub example [2], with optional matching citations like [3].

Example MDX content

You can still mix normal Markdown with lightweight MDX.

$$\sum_{i=1}^4 i = 10$$

That keeps the file small while still proving the article parses as MDX instead of plain Markdown.
